#### Roger Dean Akurra: Lives in a new world (2012)

For Alison Morgan and Jenny Duck-Chong of Halcyon, with pre-recorded multichannel sound.

The piece concerns the imagined afterlives of Akurra, the creators of Wilpena Pound (Ikara) in the Flinders Ranges of South Australia, a great isolated valley almost completely surrounded by two mountain ranges. Where did they next appear after the pound was made? Our two singers use dislocated speech-sounds to describe and illustrate their post-history in the context of changing climates and the imagined creation scenario.

For the Adnyamathanha people of the Flinders Ranges, Akurra is a snake deity, associated with theidea of the Rainbow Serpent and the power of the shaman. In the book 'The Rainbow Serpent' (ed. I. R. Buchler; de Gruyter publishers, 1978). There are several myths which may relate to Akurra. Charles P. Mountford describes one in which there are two akaru, who destroyed a circumcision party by making powerful whirlwinds. Then 'lying head to head, [they] were transformed into the steep walls that now surround Wilpena Pound'. Late they travelled eastward and formed separate homes.

The piece tries to evoke perceptions and imaginations rather than to provide a programmatic representation of defined events.

Roger Dean is a composer/improviser, and since 2007 a research professor in music cognition and computation at the MARCS Institute, University of Western Sydney. He founded and directs the ensemble austraLYSIS, which has performed in 30 countries. He has performed as bassist and pianist in contexts from the Academy of Ancient Music and the Australian Chamber Orchestra, to the London Sinfonietta and the Hoarded Dreams Jazz Orchestra. His improvising collaborations range from Ted Curson to Derek Bailey and Evan Parker, and from Sandy Evans to Oren Ambarchi. Improvisation and computer-interaction merge in his MultiPiano Event, a solo performance exploiting live piano, real-time audio processing, generative physical synthesis piano, and electroacoustic sound. His creative work is on 50 commercial audio cds, and he has released many digital intermedia pieces, and recently, sound installation works. His 400 substantive research publications include 7 humanities books. Previously he was CEO of the Heart Research Institute, Sydney, researching in biochemistry, and then Vice-Chancellor and President of the University of Canberra.

## **Biographies**

austraLYSIS is an ensemble of composers, improvisers, and perfomers. It has developed unusual techniques for control of rhythmic, timbral and harmonic interaction in several creative and performative contexts, and since 1995 has used computer interactive and networked technology. 'Incredible interaction', said the Wire (UK); 'eclectic and consummate', said BBC Radio 3. Formed originally by Roger Dean in 1970 as the innovative European group LYSIS, austraLYSIS has played in 30 countries, and appears on more than forty commercial recordings.

austraLYSIS has evolved continuously from an ensemble in the 70s and 80s focused on commissioning and premiering new compositions, and presenting contemporary classics, together with improvised music, to one which creates real-time computer interactive work, and elaborately composed acousmatic music, often in intermedia contexts involving real-time image manipulation and text presentation and generation. Most work is created by members of the ensemble, often collaboratively.

In 2010, austraLYSIS has presented work in Australia, Canada, Denmark, UK and USA, as well as broadcast internationally.

This program features Robbie Avenaim and Dale Gorfinkel from 'SSL', joined by Chris Abrahams (piano/electronics) and Cor Fuhler (piano/electronics). The extended SSL ensemble combines traditional and extended techniques with physical modification of the artists' instruments. The group will employ various motorised percussive mechanisms alongside traditional instrumentation, and in so doing, will have access to greater scope for both composing and improvising. This is an integral part of the compositional process of the group and represents a collective effort to build better relationships between mechanical devices and improvisers.
